PLIOCENE – PLEISTOCENE CONTINENTAL DEPOSITS OF NORTHERN APENNINES

16th – 18th June 2017, Perugia, Italy

Aim of the workshop

Organized in the frame of the Meeting of GeoSed-SGI, (Perugia, 16-20 June), the workshop is based in Perugia (Department Physics and Geology) with transfers to Florence and Siena surroundings during fieldtrips. It focuses on alluvial and travertine deposits accumulated in extensional Pliocene to Pleistocene basins. The workshop is open to GeoSed-SGI and BSRG student members and includes fieldtrips, lectures and sections for open discussions. The goal of this workshop experience is to allow students to exchange their ideas and develop their own international research network.

Preliminary programme

<u>Day1.</u> Lectures (E. Capezzuoli, University of Perugia; M. Ghinassi, University of Padova): geology of Northern Apennines, introduction to fieldtrip areas, student presentations (summary of MSc and PhD projects)

<u>Day2.</u> Fieldtrip: Alluvial deposits of the Pliocene – Pleistocene Upper Valdarno Basin (Leader M. Ghinassi) <u>Day3.</u> Fieldtrip: Pleistocene Travertine deposits of the Siena Basin (Leader E. Capezzuoli)

Costs

The costs are estimated to be 130 EUR/student and include training material, coffee breaks, 3-days packed lunches, minibus for fieldtrips. Students must make their own travel and accommodation arrangements.

A letter of support from applicant's supervisor needs to be attached. <u>Up to 20 students will be accepted (the first 10 applications from GeoSed-SGI and the first 10 from BSRG).</u>




